

DID YOU KNOW?

According to the Citi Private Bank Law Watch Managing Partner Confidence Index Survey, managing partners' overall confidence rating for business conditions in the legal profession over the next six months was 122, an increase of five points from the last survey. A total of 95 percent of respondents said they expected conditions to be somewhat better (49 percent) or the same (46 percent). No one thought conditions would be considerably better or considerably worse.
