#### FEELING MISUNDERSTOOD?

The International Association of Defense Counsel's (IADC) second annual Inside/Outside Counsel Relationship Survey revealed a discrepancy between inside and outside counsel's understanding of each other's business goals and operations:

- 61 percent of inside counsel reported an uptick in the amount of work they were contracting out to law firms over the last 12 months.
- Only 39 percent of outside counsel say their work from corporate clients increased over the same period.

Perhaps not surprisingly, communication was cited as a key concern on both sides.

### **CHALLENGES PAST AND PRESENT**

In 2013, ALA began deploying a comprehensive survey to its members to assess how well ALA strategic direction aligned with member challenges and expectations. More and more members have responded to the survey each year, providing a more robust picture of the needs of ALA membership.



Over the past three years, staffing, economy, technology and management were identified as the biggest challenges within the legal management profession. In 2016, more respondents mentioned the following:

- Increasing competition
- Keeping up with health care regulations
- The constant demand to "do more with less"

Predicted challenges in the next three years are similar to previous years' survey responses, with succession planning, employees retiring and talent retention being some of the most mentioned. Change management, client demands and billing issues are also a predicted concern.
