## HOMEWORK HELP (MON-THUR, 4-6PM. SEPT - MAY)

During Homework Help, volunteers help Horton's Kids participants understand assignments, prepare for tests, and/or improve study skills. Training is provided for volunteers day-of. This opportunity is best for groups of **4 - 6 volunteers**, college age and above.

Homework Help takes place at our Community Resource Center in SE DC. Groups can sign up to volunteer once or on a monthly basis (e.g. the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month).



## CENTER CLEANING (MON-THUR, 10-2PM.)

Our Community Resource Center in SE DC is the hub of all of our programming. With 100 children coming in and out every day, it often needs care and attention! Volunteers clean rooms, organize the food pantry and library, and/or paint. Cleaning supplies and a chore list are provided. This opportunity is best for groups of **6 - 15 volunteers**, high school age and above.



## OFFSITE OPPORTUNITIES

Looking for a project you can do in your office, place of worship, or home? Horton's Kids is always in need of food and toiletries for the Emergency Pantry. Additional seasonal needs include backpacks/school supplies (July), Halloween costumes (early October), Thanksgiving food and winter clothing (mid-November) and Elf Holiday Gift Program (early December).
